Who is your OPPONENT?


He does not exist.

“Notes from the Field” of the UN ESCAP



1st of May was the day of hot discussions in the UN ESCAP. Almost each out of 14 delegations present and voting expressed their desire to voice opinion of their people concerning one of the most crucial issues for the present-day Asia Pacific Region – inclusive and sustainable development of urban areas in the Region. Moreover, each proposal, each speech triggered at least 22 points of inquiry, which shows a tremendous interest of all delegates towards ideas of their colleagues.

However, as it happens very often in multilateral diplomacy, not always it was possible to find common grounds. The Russian Federation and the United States of America tried to take leading roles being extremely active during “sidelines”. Nevertheless, East Asian countries, in particular, Republic of Korea, Singapore and China are not willing the whole region to play the tune of others. Consequently, the debates process in the Commission which mainly concentrates on humanitarian and social issues looks sometimes almost similar to tough negotiations of the Security Council.

As the Asia Pacific Region is definitely the center of the world economy and world politics today, we believe that such things as professionalism and devotion to the common success will determine the debates process in the days to follow.



Heat in the Sixth Committee GA



The situation in the Sixth Committee has changed a lot comparing to the beginning of debates. Delegates “woke up”, lost their uncertainty and got much more confident. At this time committee discusses status of the Protocols Additional to the Geneva Conventions, which is not the easiest topic at all. It takes a lot of knowledge and skills to be able to debate on this topic, so delegates are doing great so far. The sixth committee is pretty loud and it is for sure that debates are hot over there. Though many delegates are very active, the absolute leader is still to be detected.

It should be noticed that creativity of delegates goes without saying. The whole committee was surprised with the unexpected 12-second strategy of delegate

What about Six-party Talks?



The first session of the Security Council's debates was hot from the very beginning. Almost fighting for the opportunity to make a speech delegates raised their placards so fast that it was hard even for the President to decide who actually was the first. There is still no obvious leader in this committee because it flows from one delegate to another all the time and everyone tries to show his/her best.

Among five topics participants chose the DPRK nuclearization as the most urgent and important one. No one will argue that this topic is very relevant to the current political situation. There were many different proposals, for example, Russian Federation suggested to establish the special economic zone for providing humanitarian aid.



Almost all the delegates consider the need of negotiations between DPRK and other countries, the re-opening of Six Party Talks is also a popular proposal but details are still to be discussed. Nevertheless, the Council has already started writing a resolution. Therefore, the Chairs are waiting the SC-28 to be raised soon.

But in spite of very tense ambience in Security Council there is still time for little bit of humor. During the first hour of debates the delegate from Pakistan used hilarious 12-second strategy that made everyone confused. "Let me speak from my poor English and nerdy speech" said he. 1. What was the greatest challenge for you at MUN Conferences?

2.What (brand) new are you planning to make at the XII International Conference as the Secretary-General?



The full countries will be represented by Argentina, Guatemala, Republic of Korea, Pakistan and the United States of America and also such countries as China, France, Morocco and Rwanda will have the observer status in Human Rights Council and thus will also be represented in all committees. By making this innovation in countries representation I want to underline the importance of each Member-State of the United Nations and it doesn't matter if it is a Permanent Member of the Security Council or not. We need to understand that Developing Countries are right now playing really crucial role in the world, so I want to reflect this importance during the XII IC. Also, the Human Rights Council is a brand new committee that were not simulated in MUNRFE for quite long period of time. Thus this committee will give the opportunity for the delegates to try themselves in the sphere of Human Rights.


