Then comes the most interesting part, who is the winner of the Teachers' Competition? Well, we will keep the secret till the banquet after the official part of the Conference.


## P-31 Credentials!?

However, this was rejected by the SG because of lack of substance.

Then, committee moved to the next agenda and discussed drugs and crime, forgetting about the rule of law. Productive caucuses were full of philosophic reasoning about drugs and hookah (кальян) in night clubs, about a Hepocrates Oath. Generally, the Assembly was extremely productive. ## Someone likes it hot



Napoleon's plan of unity and cooperation among Youth-led NGOs of the Asia Pacific Rim became the stumbling block for ESCAP delegates. As the time for debates is almost finished, nervous system of some delegates is under pressure. For example, the Ambassador of Russia was "Rrrrrr"-ing when the opposition from the US side had appeared.

As the delegation of "People's Republic of Australia" stated, it looks like PRC has fallen apart to 2 parts – Mainland China and Chinese on Australian continent. It is very important to remember, that PRC already had "another China" in Taiwan, and now we have "new addition".

The delegation of the Republic of Korea expressed its gratitude to the "Republic of China" (which means 國民黨 (guómíndǎng) (the Kuomintang) government in Taipei. Probably, that is why, the delegate of South Korea managed to solve his problem with his outfit.

The last day of the ESCAP debates promises to be full of "diplomatic games", blocks' struggle and competition till the end. However, the International Community is waiting for the comprehensive strategy elaborated by the respected Commission.

## The Nuclear Threat Unites The Koreans



The extra news having come at the end of the 2<sup>nd</sup> day of debates, resulted into the unprecedented event – the RoK and the DPRK agreed to collaborate in frames of the ongoing threat of the nuclear war that concerned even so far countries as the UK, France, Guatemala and Argentina.

The “Public Speaking” competition happening during first two days, transformed into the really productive negotiations between former enemies. Finally the Security Council managed to formulate the draft of the resolution.

The draft of the resolution demanded both Koreas to the refrain from any acts of aggression, demanded the DPRK to stop nuclear tests and sent the UN Special Envoy to initiate the bilateral dialog between Parties of the conflict and clarify the actions of the USA Navy concerning the incident on the Sea of Japan.



The last clause of the draft caused additional disputes between pro-NATO States and other Member States of the Security Council due to the priority of national law over the international agreements in the USA. Therefore the committee managed to submit the second draft (de-facto amended 1<sup>st</sup> draft) only by the very end of the Session. Moreover, the committee even didn't catch time to move to substantive debates, still saving the opportunity to provide new draft of the resolution.

Will the Security Council be able to complete with the task to provide peace and security on Korean Peninsula or the political clashes damaged the fragile agreement? The final Session of the Security Council shall show the real opportunity of the committee to take productive decision.

we are again doing blablabla and blablabla”





Russia: “We would like to respond to the numerous speeches of numerous delegates.”




